Murt Byrne is the founder and director of one of the largest veterinary clinics in New Mexico. During his 20 years as a vet he has provided care to thousands of animals in distress. During that time veterinary medicine has evolved dramatically. Today many very sick animals can be treated successfully who could not have been at an earlier time. Spend part of an evening with Murt and find out what the life of a veterinarian is all about.

In 1993 he opened the Eldorado Animal Clinic, a state of the art practice with 4 veterinarians serving the Eldorado/Santa Fe communities. In 2008 he was named “New Mexico Veterinarian of the Year.” Dr Byrne has 2 children, an Irish Terrier and 3 cats, all living happily in El Dorado.
